Destin Seafood Festival Museum Parking Concession



The Destin Chamber of Commerce held the Destin Seafood Festival on September 17, 18, & 19. The site was the Fisherman's Wharf location on the Harbor. Alan Laird & AJ's World Famous Seafood & Oyster Bar donated the use of their off-site parking lot for the Museum to use for a parking concession. Each car parked at the \$5 donation was given a free admission coupon for the Museum and a \$5 coupon for AJ's. The parking concession brought in \$1,835 for the Museum's program and exhibit creation.

Oral History Project



With many thanks to Lewis Bear, Jr. and the Appleyard Agency, the Oral History Project is getting closer to being a reality !
